2013 Learning Information

I am offering a new one-day class. The title is **Accessing the Power of Traditional Bodywork Systems**. The class is about how a *system* of bodywork moves magnifies the results of what you do. And it's not just me- since my practice is mostly Trager and I don't do Swedish anymore, I get asked often- do I know any therapists who will do a Swedish Massage without poking and fixing and testing and throwing in energy work or cranial while they work.

The value in Swedish massage to your practice is this- clients who want preventive health and longevity will book a Swedish Massage <u>every week</u>. This can be the bread and butter of your practice IF you can give a true Swedish Massage- and not just any Swedish Massage but an excellent Swedish Massage. The class is offered with a follow up on the next day of **Word Crafting** for 2 hours in Marketing and **Ethics** for 3 hours with the topic of **Giving and Receiving Feedback** from Clients and Colleagues (both verbal and non-verbal). Word Crafting is an experiential session in refining your "talk" around what you do and why. The focus is verbal and written. It is important to re-visit this exercise periodically in your career because your goals change, and who you are and how you think about your work changes as well. Bindegewebsmassage

Level 2: Bindegewebsmassage: Upper Extremity & Torso (prerequisite-

Review Basic buildup; Add in special strokes for the back; Upper Extremity (arm) strokes; Torso- front (Ribcage and belly); Wrist & Hand strokes.

Bindegewebsmassage: Basic- Treat medical conditions you never thought you could treat with massage!

A reflexive therapy of the connective tissue, this structured medical massage protocol was developed by a German Physiotherapist and enjoys widespread use in Europe. The technique is particularly useful for difficult to treat conditions, including most inflammatory conditions, adhesions, breathing problems, menstrual problems, frozen shoulder, blood pressure, migraines, sinus conditions, to name a few. Treatments engage the reflexes of the connective tissue and the autonomic nervous system to bring on powerful healing responses in the body.

All treatments begin at the sacrum, activating the parasympathetic portion of the autonomic nervous system. Treatments are generally given to the client in a seated position; the client wears underwear and a hospital gown.

Each course is 4 classes, 4 hours each. Practice session required in between class 2 & 3 (approximately 1/2 hour).
